

Fleabane, Common





Common Fleabane (Pulicaria Dysenterica) is a perennial member of the daisy family which grows to a height of 50-90cm. The petal leaves and the disc floret are golden yellow and the flower is 2-3cm across. The flowers are not long lasting they will appear in August and then die off by mid September.

Common Fleabane is found on banks of streams as they prefer marshy damp soil with full sunlight, this makes them ideal for pond edges which will attract a range of insects. Fleabane will respond well to deheading if you want continuous blooming.

Sowing Time: Spring/Autumn

Sowing Spacing: 23-45cm
