

Cowslip



Cowslip (*Primula veris*) is a cousin of the Primrose and is an early spring flower. The flowers are deep yellow with an orange base which are arranged in an umbel and usually droop to one side, reaching a height of 25cm. The green leaves are covered on both sides with a fine layer of hairs.

Cowslip thrives best in moist, free draining sites. This species is in tolerant of water logged soils and is rarely found in shaded areas. It produces a reasonable amount of seed and in disturbed areas it may establish itself to form a wider population.

Sowing Time: Late Summer/Autumn

Sowing Depth: Seed should be sowed with its own depth of soil.
