

Daisy





Daisy (Bellis Perennis) is a flower made up of white petals and a yellow centre, a daisy is made up of two types of flowers; disk florets and petal like white ray florets. Stems are smooth and leafless which support a single flower, height of up to 25cm.

Daisy will grow on most soils and should be planted in sunny locations, however, if temperature gets warm then consider shade. This is a low growing species but has a long flowering period from March to September.

Removal of spent flowers will help extend the flowering season into the fall, in late fall they should be cut right down.

Common daises: African, English, Gloriosa, Painted, Pyrethrum and Shasta.

Sowing Time: Spring/Autumn

Sowing Depth: Set the plants about 9-12 inches apart
