

Dandelion





Dandelion (Taraxacum Officinale) is perennial which grows from an unbranching tap root. The seeds of the dandelion are brown and dry which have long stalked parachutes for easy wind dispersal.

The leaves are mid to dark green and emerge from the crown of the plant at ground level. Flower heads are yellow 2.5-5cm across and sit on a hollow stem. The flower head is a mass of many individual flowers which flower from March to October.

Dandelion is common in pastures, lawns, orchards, hay fields and road sides.

Seedlings emerge from March to October with a bulk appearing in March-April and then the odd seedlings through to October. Most seedlings emerge two years after the seed has been shed.

Sowing Time: Early March to Early September

Sowing Depth: Surface sow and thinly cover seed, plant spacing is 12-16 inches apart.
