

## Harebell



Harebell (Campanula rotundifolia) is a creeping perennial. Harebells have long, trailing stems with small leaves at the base. Its stem leaves are elongated with blue bell shaped flowers hanging in clusters at the tip of the stem. Flowering occurs between July to September.

Will grow on dry and mostly undisturbed ground but can be found on a variety of habitats. Harebell habitats include hedgerows, grasslands, hillsides, sand dunes and cliffs. Harebells look best growing with other low growing chalk and limestone plants that flower in mid summer such as Wild Majoram, Wild Thyme, Bladder Campion and Small Scabious.

This wildflower provides a source of nectar and is regularly visited by bumblebees.
