

Musk Mallow



Musk Mallow (Malva moschata) appear in July and August and have five petals which are pale pink with fine darker pink veins, reaching a height of 3 feet. It is native to Western and Central Europe. Blooms when mature have a diameter of 4cm which produces a musky fragrance.

Musk Mallow is a perennial flower which thrives on well drained soils. It is found on roadside verges, hedgerows and pastures. It should be in full sunlight and needs to be watered during prolonged dry spells. Musk Mallow should also be cut back to the ground in Autumn.

Musk Mallow is ideal to attract butterflies and bees to your garden.

Sowing Time: Spring/Autumn

Sow 25cm apart
