

Daisy, Oxeye



Daisy Oxeye (Leucanthemum Vulgare) is a grassland perennial wildflower and is the largest native member of the daisy family. Has a medium tall stem which is topped by one flower of white petals surrounding a yellow disc floret, reaching a height of 30-60cm.

Oxeye Daisy requires moist but well drained soil and requires to be in full sun as long as the temperature is not boiling. If the temperature gets to warm then partial shade is required.

Oxeye Daisy grows best in meadows, pastures and road side verges. Deadhead to prolong flowering, stems need to be cut down to ground level in the late autumn.

Sowing Time: September

Sowing Depth: 30-45cm apart
