

Pendulous Sedge



Pendulous Sedge (*Carex pendula*) is a perennial, forming large clumps of dark or yellow leaves depending on the time of year. The plant stem grows around 1m long but can grow up to 3.5m. The flowering body is yellow in colour and droops down.

Flowering from May to June.

Pendulous sedge is native and found wild in damp woods in shady places. It does best in cool, and damp soils. Because of its attractive foliage and flowers, it is often used as a garden plant at the edges of ponds. Pendulous Sedge looks best growing with other wet-land plants such as Ragged Robin and Yellow Flag Iris.

Spent flower stems need to be cut back .

Sowing Time: Spring/Autumn
