

Meadow Vetchling



Meadow Vetchling (Lathyrus pratensis) is a scrambling plant with long stems that end with a group of yellow flowers. The flowers are followed by shiny, black seed pods containing 4-8 seeds. Meadow Vetchling grows up to 1.2m.

Meadow Vetchling is a native perennial of moderate fertile soil found in a range of grasslands including meadows, hedges, banks and unimproved grazed pastures. Its scrambling habit can result in it becoming locally dominant.

Deadhead regularly and cut back after flowering in autumn.

Sowing Time: Spring
