

Vipers Bugloss





Vipers Bugloss (Echium vulgare) has tall spikes of vivid blue flowers with rough petals and red tongue like stamens. Each flower is around 2-3cm long.

Flowering from June to September.

Vipers Bugloss is a hardy biennial which requires free draining reasonably open grassland or disturbed soil on which its seed can germinate. Vipers Bugloss has a deep and persistent root which allows it to exploit free draining soils. Found on chalk grasslands, sand dunes, cliffs and disturbed grounds.

It provides food for a range of insects including bees and butterflies.

Vipers Bugloss requires little care once established and no fertiliser is necessary.

Deadheading can be done to encourage blooming.

Sowing Time: Spring
