

Mignonette, Wild





Wild Mignonette (Reseda Lutea) rises from rosette of leaves, the flowers are on short 2cm stalks. Standing 12-30 inches high and carries small six petalled greenish yellow flowers, flowers June to September.

Grows best in dry grasslands and is well suited to chalk, limestone or sandy soils, sites in full sun. Wild Mignonette are found on well drained soils in open habitats such as; roadside verges, grasslands, quarries in chalk and limestone soils. Wild Mignonette looks best growing with other limestone plants such as; Oxeye Daises, Kidney Vetch and Greater Knapweed.
