

Yellow Iris Flag



Yellow Iris Flag (*Iris pseudacorus*), has tall stems that are sometimes branched reaching a height of 1.5 metres. It has long, narrow leaves which are sword like and may droop at the ends. Yellow flower petals fold back on themselves and flower between May and August. When in bloom they are roughly 8cm in diameter.

Yellow Iris Flag is a perennial plant that is native to Europe, North Africa and the Mediterranean areas. Can be found along wetlands, streams, rivers and lakes in shallow mud or water. However, it can become invasive, so appropriate care is necessary.

This plant is an ideal plant to attract bees, hoverflies and butterflies.

Sowing Time: October to March

Space plants 18-24 inches apart
