Californian Poppy - Orange *Eschscholzia californica*



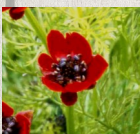
The Californian Poppy has been California's state flower since 1890. This fast growing, hardy annual brings beautiful colour to any garden and thrives best in poor, well drained soil and full sun. Vibrant orange blooms appear from June to September and deadheading will prolong flowering. Perfect for pollinators!

Coneflower *Echinacea purpurea*



A hardy perennial that can tolerate most soil types and likes full sun/light shade. It produces large, daisy like flowers with protruding centres that rise above the petals, and this is where it gets the name Coneflower. The blooms appear from June to September, are attractive to pollinators and make great cut flowers.

Pheasants Eye *Adonis annua*



This unusual cornfield annual is rare in the wild. Its distinctive wine red flowers bloom from June to July and have large black centres containing bulky seeds that look like pips. It has bright green feathery foliage and grows up to 50cm. Thrives best in full sun and well drained soil.

Cosmos *Cosmos bipinnatus*



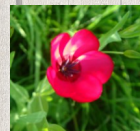
A delightful half hardy annual that thrives best in full sun and well drained soil. Its pretty flowers bloom from delicate lacy foliage from June to September and are attractive to butterflies. A tall bushy plant that can grow to 2.5m tall.



Non-Native Wildflower Seeds



Scarlet Flax *Linum grandiflorum rubrum*



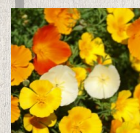
An easy to grow, hardy annual that thrives best in full sun and well drained soil. Stunning scarlet flowers with darker centres, bloom amongst fresh green foliage from May to September. When sunlight catches the flowers, they glisten due to their high oil content. Can grow to a height of 45cm and once established, can tolerate hot, dry conditions.

Cornflower - Double Ball *Centaurea cyanus*



A very pretty annual, that produces double blooms from June to September. The flowers are larger than normal cornflowers and attractive to bees and butterflies. Can grow to approximately 75cm tall and prefers full sun/partial shade and well drained soil.

Californian Poppy - Mixed *Eschscholzia californica*

Love in a Mist *Nigella damascena*



A bushy annual that requires a sheltered spot in full sun and well drained soil. Its unusual pale blue flowers are surrounded by fine green spikes and bloom from July to September. It produces feathery foliage and can grow up to 50cm.
